

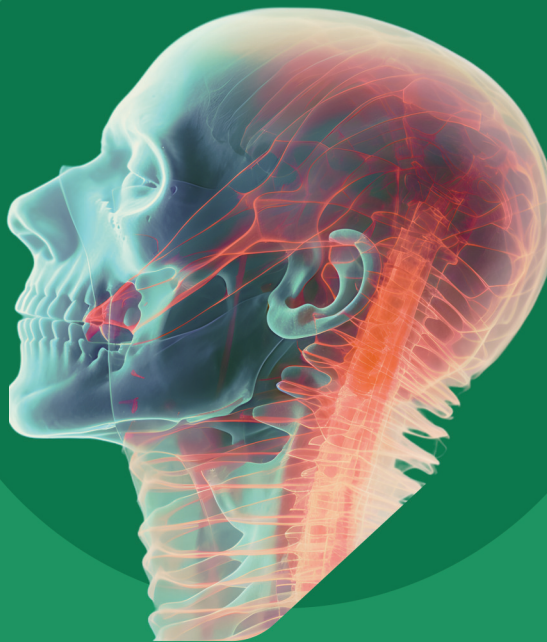

Foreword by President of IHNS - Prof Patrick Sheahan

It is my great pleasure to welcome you to the 3rd annual meeting of the Irish Head and Neck Society. The IHNS is a truly multidisciplinary Head & Neck society, with members spanning the specialties of Otolaryngology (ENT), Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Plastic Surgery, Dentistry, Radiation Oncology, Medical Oncology, Pathology, Radiology, Nursing, Speech & Language Therapy, Nutrition & Dietetics, Physiotherapy, Clinical Psychology, Occupational Therapy, Social Work, and others.

Our previous meetings in 2022 and 2023 were overwhelming successes. For our inaugural meeting in 2022, we had 120 registered delegates, 65 attendances at the conference dinner, and an outstanding scientific program featuring 6 international guest speakers, and 38 oral (26) or poster (12) scientific presentations.

In 2023 this had grown to 158 registered delegates, 80 attendances at the conference dinner, and a program featuring 8 international guest speakers, and 46 oral (17) or poster (29) scientific presentations.

This year's meeting promises to be even a greater success. We have a world-class program featuring 12 international speakers, all recognised as true leaders within their fields of Head & Neck Cancer. We have accepted 68 scientific papers for oral or poster presentation.

Innovating this year, we're introducing e-posters, with four parallel oral e-poster sessions on Saturday morning, allowing for a total of 37 oral podium or e-poster presentations. Alongside our academic agenda, our social program offers rich networking opportunities, fostering connections across specialties.
